INTRODUCTION

Data Collection Methods

The Family Court of New York has exclusive original jurisdiction over any proceeding to determine whether a person under age 16 is a juvenile delinquent. Data are reported by the 57 Family Courts in the counties in "upstate" New York and the Family Court in each of the five counties that comprise City of New York. The 62 Family Courts, report to the Office of Court Administration, a description of each petitioned delinquency after a definite (although possibly not final) disposition is made. It needs to be emphasized that data are not reported on delinquency or status offense referrals handled informally by the county probation departments. Also the system collects no information on cases involving juveniles (under age 16) which are filed directly in criminal (adult) court and juvenile traffic cases. Reporting is done on Disposition Reporting Cards (see Appendix I). Disposition Reporting Card JC-103 is used to report dispositions for delinquency cases not involving "designated felony" offenses and status offense cases. Upon receiving the cards the Office of Court Administration checks the data for internal validity. Identified errors are corrected after checking with the court which completed the form.

The authority for the Office of Court Administration to collect data from the Family Court is stated in the Family Court Act, Section 213.

Publications

Each year these data are the basis of the report entitled Annual Report of the Chief Administrator of the Courts which includes tables summarizing Family Court activity for the previous year.

Archived Data Files

Each year the National Juvenile Court Data Archive asks the Office of Court Administration to create a data file containing the case records of all petitioned delinquency and status offense cases disposed during the calendar year by the Family Courts of New York and reported to them. The file contains a separate record for each case disposed. Records contain information on the county in which the case was handled, date petition filed, date fact-finding completed, date hearing completed, date most recent act committed, age of youth when act committed, sex, type of petition, originator of petition, original allegation of petition, legal representation of respondent, counsel presenting petition, number of days detained before petition, number of days detained after petition, courts' determination upon completion of fact-finding, title of established allegation, section of established allegation, admission by respondent, adjudication, disposition of petition. The National Juvenile Court Data Archive staff has checked the data for invalid code values. When found, such codes were replaced with missing data values.

Each case record is 111 characters in length and contains 43 variables, three of them created by Archive staff. The data are stored in single year files. The number of case records on each calendar year data file is as follows:

Box 1248, Ann Arbor, Michigan. 48106.

USING THE CODEBOOK

The information that follows is based on a study of available documentation from the data supplier, interviews with the data supplier and court personnel, and diagnostic analyses performed by the Archive staff. The example below is a reproduction of information appearing in the codebook for a typical variable. The numbers in brackets do not appear in the codebook, but are references to the descriptions which follow this example.

- [1] The starting location and width of the variable in the machine-readable data file. This is the format information needed to read the data into other systems.
- [2] The variable number. The variable number is used as a variable name when the file is processed by systems which use alphabetic variable names (e.g. SPSS).
- [3] The variable label used by statistical systems to identify the variable or program output.
- [4] A description of the variable contents.
- [5] The code values occurring in the data for the variable. If the variable is a year, the symbol ## represents the most current year for which data are available.
- [6] The textual definitions of the codes. The first 20 characters form a short value label which some systems use to document the output of analysis programs. A longer description follows the short label when necessary.
- [7] The designation of missing data. The Archive staff has replaced any out-of-bounds codes with missing data codes. Many analysis packages require that certain types of data which are usually excluded from analysis be designated as "missing data". Fields with no entry were left blank and "() No entry" is listed as a code value. Some variables also have response options representing "unknown" which are also listed as code values.


